

Constitution and Bylaws of the Butler University Women's Club Soccer Team

- I. Butler University Women's Club Soccer
- II. The Butler University Women's Club Soccer Team is an organization providing the highest level of non-NCAA competition found at Butler University. The team offers a balance of intense competition and high level of commitment on the field with an active social life off the field.
- III. Membership will be decided based upon:
 - a. An annual tryout will be held in the fall during the second week of school. Based on your abilities as a soccer player comparative to the other players at the tryouts, you will either be accepted or declined membership. Should any unfavorable acts be committed by anyone on the team, the team and advisor shall decide whether or not it requires a termination.
 - b. Dues for the team will be \$100.00 per team member per season and will be collected the week following the week of tryouts.
 - c. The Butler University Women's Club Soccer Team and its officers comply with the nondiscrimination policy of Butler University.
- IV. The Butler University Women's Club Soccer Team will elect officers by vote the week after the tryouts have ended and a team has been selected. Everyone on the team gets one vote and majority rules. In the case of a tie, the entire team's votes will be erased and a vote will be taken solely upon the two candidates nominated. If still a tie exists, then the advisor of the Butler University Women's Club soccer team must make an executive decision.
- V. An election will be given the week after tryouts have been held and once a team has been made. For each elected officer, the term held is one year in office. Should an officer be relieved of her duties, a suitable replacement shall be agreed upon by the team majority and the vacancy filled.
- VI. The president of the Butler University Women's Club Soccer team is responsible for scheduling intercollegiate competition, handling any student government affairs in general, and upholding any intercollegiate affairs between other institutions. The Vice President is in charge of scheduling practices through a team majority vote based upon when a majority of the team is available to practice. The Treasurer is responsible for all monetary issues involving the club including fees and fundraisers for the team. The Secretary is responsible for any paperwork assigned by the student government as well as notification of the team for any meetings and intercollegiate competition.
- VII. In the event of a meeting, the Secretary will notify all members of the team either through phone or email.
- VIII. The Butler University Women's Club Soccer team has adopted a majority vote rules authority to be accepted by the team. In the event of a tie, the advisor of the Butler University Women's Club soccer team must make an executive decision.
